Celebrate National Poetry Month at Renne Library

National Poetry Month, held in April, is a month-long, national celebration of poetry established by the Academy of American Poets. The concept is to widen the attention of individuals and the media to the art of poetry and to living poets.

A display of Montana poets can be viewed in the lobby of the library. In addition, we are very pleased to have two distinguished poets who will read their poetry aloud in the atrium of the library. Dates, times, and information about the poets are below.

Monday, April 13 - 1:30 pm. Greg Keeler, Professor from the Dept. English

Greg Keeler is an accomplished musician, poet, and writer who also happens to be an avid fisherman. He has published three books and three chapbooks of poetry, produced ten tapes and CDs of his satirical songs, published many articles in popular and academic magazines and journals and had six plays produced. His acrylic paintings have been exhibited at Renne Library and in galleries in and around Bozeman. In 2001, he received the Montana Governor's Award in the Humanities.

Friday, April 17 - 12:00pm. Greg Pape, Montana's Poet Laureate

Greg Pape has been a member of the creative writing faculty at University of Montana since 1987. He is the author of 7 books of poetry, including *American Flamingo*, *Border Crossings*, and *Black Branches*. He has received two National Endowment for the Arts Fellowships, the Richard Hugo Memorial award for Poetry, A Pushcart Prize and others.

**An additional program will be held on Friday evening at the Bozeman Public Library. This event begins with a wine reception at 6:30 pm, followed by a reading and discussion in the Community Room by Greg Pape.
