## Request It!

MSU Libraries just made it easier for you to conduct research. Don't waste time photocopying or running to the shelves to retrieve a book. Leave that to us.

Request It! is a combination of existing and new services available to you. You can request materials either owned by MSU or available at other institutions.

Here are a couple of highlights:

*Document Delivery* - Request digital scans of journal articles owned by the MSU Library. (i.e. No more coming to the library to photocopy articles!)

*Book Retrieval* - Library staff will retrieve items from the stacks and hold them at the Circulation Desk for check out. (Unfortunately we don't make house calls but now you can swing by the circulation desk to pick up the book instead of going to the shelves).

Typical delivery times for these two services is 1-2 business days.
