## WHAT DOES THE FOX SAY?

The library is a place to start your search for answers, but did you know that your answer could be as simple as the click of the play button? With MSU Library's Acoustic Atlas, you can find out what the fox really says with digital recordings of the red fox in Yellowstone National Park and in Washington state.

The Acoustic Atlas is a growing collection with more than 2,000 animal and nature sounds from Montana and the western United States. From an elk bugle to the rustle of earthworms moving through soil to the sounds of radio signals colliding with a meteor shower, Acoustic Atlas allows anyone with a connection to the internet to hear the voice of an ecosystem. In many disciplines including biology, media arts, and education, these sounds provide a rich resource for study and research. Hear the world differently at
